- Lead, support & supervise campers throughout their whole camp experience.
- Assume responsibility for the health and welfare of all campers.
- Apply basic youth-development principles in working with campers through communication, relationship development, respect for diversity, involvement, and empowerment of young people.
- Observe camper behaviour, apply appropriate behaviour management techniques & enforce safety regulations.
- Maintain high standards of health and safety in all activities for campers and staff.
- Serve as a role model to campers in personal language, appearance and health habits.

- Assume responsibility for enforcing the rules, policies, safety procedures, and traditions of the camp with a positive attitude. Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Respectful.
- Participate enthusiastically in all camp activities.
- Develop lesson plans based on activity guidelines from Camp Director that cater to each camper and their skill level.
- Implement the program, with the assistance of all staff members activities
- Teach and monitor proper use of equipment.
- Set up and take down of activity areas daily, including checking for safety concerns and cleanliness.
